Since he was elected president of the Indian Nations SFA Chapter, Rock Taylor has been pushing to invite former Hmong fighters to one of our meetings. Fortunately, chapter member, Russell Higbie, who serves as a Sergeant At Arms for the Oklahoma legislature, was present when Hmong Special Guerrilla fighters were recently recognized there. More than 70 Hmong refugees and family members attended our meeting, where the above listed veterans were presented with Chapter Challenge Coins and SFA Certificates of Achievement. Not to be outdone, the guests gave Hmong necklaces to President Rock Taylor and Russ Higbie. We were further treated to traditional dancing by the ladies. Senator Jett gave a moving talk about the accomplishments of the Hmong, noting that more than 35,000 were killed fighting the communists in Vietnam. Coming from high mountainous areas, the Hmong are famous as fierce soldiers who hate communism. Jett, a former Navy intelligence officer, reported nearly 2500 Hmong families (over 6000 individuals) now reside in Oklahoma. Speaking on behalf of the Hmong community was their elected leader, Steve Vang, in addition to the President of the Oklahoma Hmong Association. Thank you to Russ Higbie, Jerry Cooper, Rock Taylor, Jim Selders and others for their hard work and planning that made the meeting a great success.

Jerry George Haney 31 DEC 1934 — 15 AUG 2024

Jelly George Haney, 89, of Shawne, OK, died in his home surrounded by family, on 15 AUG 2024. Jerry was born 31 DEC 1934, in Haney, Oklahoma, 12 miles Northeast of Seminole, OK, on the Seminole Nation Reservation. He is the fifth of eight children, and was the last living child of Winey and Wiley Haney. Jerry started school at Haney School, located on the Haney Family's allotted land. At this time, he was taught solely in his native language, Seminole (Muskogee). At age 5, the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) removed Jerry from the Haney Community and sent him to the Euchee Indian Mission Boarding School, in Sapulpa, OK. Jerry stayed at boarding school until his sophomore year, when he moved back home, starting at Strothers High School, where he graduated in 1953. While at Strothers, he met his future wife, Barbara Anne Smith (Haney).

Jerry and Barbara wed, on May 3rd, 1956, and they were married for 68 years, until his passing. They had 5 children, Terri Denise Haney, of Shawnee, OK; Tammi Michelle James, of Shawnee, OK; Michael Lance Haney, of Little, OK; Gregory Scott Haney, of Shawnee, OK; and Ranea Haney, who passed away at 7 months of age. They have ten grandchildren and eleven great-grandchildren.

After high-school graduation, Jerry enlisted in the U.S. Army, in 1954, Jerry was part of the 11th Airborne Division, and he was stationed in Europe for 4 years. In 1959, Jerry became part of the elite 9th Special Forces Group (Airborne), after qualifying as a parachutist, jump master, and infantry. The 9th Special Forces Group later became the 12th Special Forces Group (Airborne).

In the Special Forces Reserve, Jerry made two deployments to Alaska. In 1973, he deployed to Panama with A Co, 2BN, 12th Special Forces Group (Abn); He also made deployments to Okinawa and Korea (Team Spirit).

Jerry retired as a Master Sergeant from the Army Reserve in 1980, and from the Civil Service in 1988, after working at Tinker Air Force Base. In Special Forces, Jerry served most of his time on a 12-man A-Detachment, which he described as "the most exciting time of being a Green Beret. There was never a dull moment."

In 1989, Jerry was elected Principal Chief of the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma, serving three consecutive terms, from 1989 to 2003. During his tenure, the Seminole Nation Travel Plaza, casinos, and multiple community centers and tribal buildings were constructed. They are still in use today. While Chief, Jerry was elected President of the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes, serving with other noted tribal leaders. His time on the Inter-Tribal Council and as Principal Chief allowed Jerry to fight for tribal Sovereignty nationally. He had the privilege of meeting with three Presidents in the Oval Office.

After retiring from Special Forces, civil service, and as Principal Chief, Jerry was a full-time artist - which runs deep in the veins of the Haney Family. His detailed wood and stone sculptures can be found in museums and private collections nationwide. Of note, Jerry commemorated his military background and sculpted Native busts of the five branches of the military, which can be seen at the Florida Seminole Veteran's Museum.

Aside from raising his family, and leading his tribe, one of Jerry's proudest moments was organizing the world-renowned, Seminole Nation Honor Guard, which has been honoring veterans since 1986. He served as the First Commander of the Honor Guard, the first Native American Honor Guard in the country.

A wake service was held Monday, August 19, 2024, at Swearingen Funeral Home, in Seminole. On Tuesday, 20 AUG 2024, at 1400 hours, 20 Chapter members attended MSG Haney's funeral, at the Seminole First Baptist Church. Pastor Dan Factor, an Assistant Chief of the Seminole Tribe under Jerry Haney, officiated the services. It was standing room only, and numerous tribal dignitaries, in addition to the chiefs of other tribes attended. Pursuant to custom, the Chapter members sang "The Ballad of The Green Beret", and the family was presented with a Medal of Excellence, a Certificate of Achievement and an engraved Chapter 32-50 challenge coin. Interment was at Little Cemetery.

This event will provide Special Forces Benevolent Organizations, Sponsors, and friends many opportunities to engage with over 7 decades of generations of Special Forces Soldiers and their Families in formal and mostly informal settings. Since it is a charter, every venue on the ship will be available to schedule to best suit specific programs, symposiums, discussions, and lunch/dinner sessions at no additional cost to the sponsor or individual.

Prepare to be inspired by an exceptional lineup of keynote speakers who have conquered adversity and achieved remarkable success both during and after their military service. Hear stories of resilience, leadership, and triumph, drawing upon the lessons learned from your time in the Special Forces and applying them to your civilian life.
