Harvey Pratt, Cheyenne Peace Chief, nationally famous forensic artist, and Vietnam Marine vet, told us about the new National Native Veterans Memorial, in Washington, D.C. Harvey's proposed design for the memorial was chosen by the Smithsonian Institution over the submissions of more than 500 competing artists, after which he helped raise more than \$30 million dollars in non-tax money to build it. Harvey further participated in and oversaw the Memorial's completion. The design is based on what Harvey described as "the circle of relationship" between humanity and everything else in the world. Harvey stressed that visiting the memorial and the accompanying museum provides a meaningful interactive experience that is not soon forgotten. A visit to the National Native Veterans Memorial and museum should be on all of our bucket lists.
